



# Massachusetts Municipal Light Plant Solar Program



## Program Details

The new Massachusetts Municipal Light Plant Solar Program allows residential customers of municipal light plants, such as the Sterling Municipal Light Department, to apply for a rebate for the purchase, installation, and usage of PV solar panels on their homes.

The program includes a solar rebate of \$1.20/watt, capped at \$3,000 per system. Eligible solar installations must be 10 kW or less, with less than 20% shading, and facing between 90 and 270 degrees. The rebate applies to the first 5 kW of each project. Other restrictions may apply.

## How to Apply

Interested customers must obtain pre-approval from SMLD, then submit an application with the Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC), SMLD's joint action agency. The form can be found online at [www.mmwec.org](http://www.mmwec.org). Customers may call 413-308-1400 to check application status.

Application deadline is March 30, 2020; rebate subject to availability.



### Step One

Obtain pre-approval from SMLD and submit application to MMWEC. Upon successful review, MMWEC will forward it to the Massachusetts Department of Energy Resources (DOER).



### Step Two

After the DOER evaluates the application, customers will be notified of their rebate status.



### Step Three

Upon approval, customers have one year to schedule and complete installation of their solar panels. The rebate will be paid to the customer by MMWEC.
